## Prime Minister Youth Program is free from politics and based on transparency, Special Assistant on Youth Affairs Shaza Fatima Khawaja

Islamabad: March 1<sup>st</sup>, The Special Assistant to the Prime Minister for Youth Affairs, Shaza Fatima Khawaja, has stated that the Prime Minister Youth Program is a transparent initiative that is free from politics. The program is aimed at empowering and supporting the youth of Pakistan. The Special Assistant also mentioned that several measures, including the provision of free laptops to eligible and deserving youth, are being taken to achieve this goal. During the Week of Youth, various programs were organized, including competitions in youth start-ups under the title of Future Architects of the Week of Youth, football and volleyball trials under the Prime Minister's Talent Hunt program, and a 10 km marathon race organized with the support of the United Arab Emirates.

Khawaja highlighted that the Prime Minister Youth Program provides traditional and non-traditional skills to young people. It aims to train 10,000 youth in different skills. Green Youth Clubs have also been established in government universities to promote innovative ideas and achieve sustainable development goals. Additionally, National Innovation Awards have been launched.

Khawaja informed the media that the mobile application of the youth program has been launched. It provides all necessary information about the facilities provided, and applications for business and agriculture loans can also be made through the app.

In conclusion, the Special Assistant reiterated that the Prime Minister Youth Program is transparent and apolitical. It aims to support and empower young people and equip them with the necessary skills to succeed in their future endeavors.
